Carson Kissell, the son of Kristy & David, was born in April 2007 with a rare genetic skin disease called Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB).

EB is characterized by the presence of extremely fragile skin and recurrent blister formation, resulting from minor friction or trauma. People with EB are often associated with butterflies, because their skin is as fragile as a butterfly's wings.

In its first two years, the Walk for EB has raised \$40,000 to benefit the EB Medical Research Foundation (EBMRF). The EBMRF has helped to fund research at places such as the Dermatology Department at the University of Southern California and the Dermatology Department at Stanford University.

With this research, progress is being made, but more funds are needed as doctors continue to work towards treatment, and ultimately, a cure for EB. Invite your family and friends, and join us on May 1 as we help to do our part here in Cincinnati and walk in the hopes of finding a cure for EB!
